# RESULTS OF THE 2021 <u>COLLEGE ALCOHOL SURVEY\*</u> COMPARISON WITH 2018 RESULTS, 1994 RESULTS AND BASELINE YEAR

# \* The College Alcohol Survey

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## **Research Procedure:**

A representative sample of 330 colleges and universities offering at least the BA or BS degree was selected from each of 50 states and the District of Columbia. Where possible, seven institutions of higher education were selected from each state with a representation of institutions ensured by using variation in institution size and public and private status as variables for selection. The first survey was mailed in 1979 to the vice-presidents of student affairs, who were requested to direct the survey to the most appropriate person(s) on their campuses. Non-respondents were sent a reminder 4 weeks after the initial mailing. The same procedure with the same population was used for the 1982, 1985, 1988, 1991, 1994, 1997, 2000, 2003, 2006, 2009, 2012, 2015, 2018 and 2021 surveys. Beginning in 2012, respondents were provided an additional option of completing the survey using on-line data collection software; the on-line data collection process was the preferred choice starting in 2018, with written submissions also accepted. The sample size reduced to 324 by 2015 and 322 by 2021 due to institutional closures.

### Research History:

The College Alcohol Survey was conducted from 1979 to 2012 by Dr. David Anderson and Dr. Angelo Gadaleto. This research, conducted with no external funding, was conducted using the same methodology over 42 years and 15 survey administrations. With Dr. Gadaleto's retirement, the research was co-directed with Dr. Santos for 2 survey administrations, and Dr. Anderson for 2021.
